On Program Evidence Items

The following items will be completed while you are on the On-Program part of the Pathway please make sure the below check list is completed and is signed by your On-Program Leader.

Assessment Criteria – Skills & Knowledge	Completed
Draw a sketch of a planned build, stating the knots/lashings and indicating their locations	
Construct a scale model of a structure I planned to build.	
Identify hazards and relevant controls that should be used on a Pioneering Activity	
Demonstrate how to properly maintain an axe including sharpening and examining for damage.	
Assist with the setup of a Log & Picket Anchorage	
Demonstrate how to use a block and tackle to lift pioneering structures	
Demonstrate possible dangers when lifting structures above head height and what controls can be used to prevent injury	
Assist with the selection of the required poles for any of the planned structures	
Inspect equipment to ensure it is suitable	
Work with a team to plan and construct a major project which is 5m high or 10m long or can shelter a minimum of a patrol	

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Discuss possible improvements to an existing Structure	
Assist with pack down and ensure equipment is properly stored	
The candidate has demonstrated appropriate attitude and skills in pioneering activities and is considered to be satisfactory as a Trained Participant.

 4. A Camp Table that will support at least four while they are eating
- Include a number of photos of the structures you have assisted with the construction of.
