# **NSW Scouts Adventurous Activities**

### Scoutskills Prior Achievement Recognition & Approver Observation Capture Sheet

### **Trained Participant Core**

Many Venturers, Rovers and Leaders will have obtained the skills necessary to gain recognition through achievement in either the Youth Program, previous iterations of the Scoutskills framework, or through participation in activities in their group. This capture sheet provides an avenue to request recognition of those achievements.

Scoutskills for Trained Participant Core Units is approved by a NSW Adventurous Activity Guide or a Leader who holds both a Wood Badge and the Trained Participant Core Units.

Scoutskills may provide evidence toward external qualifications but may not provide all the required evidence. Scoutskills assessment criteria are derived from, and informed by, Units of Competency.

The Scoutskills Sessions, which make up the Trained Participant Core are outlined in the following table based on the Version 11.1 of the NAAF Appendix 3 "Pathway Groupings for Adventurous Activities" dated November 2022 available here.

In NSW, the Session: "Select, set up and operate a temporary or overnight site" is also required as is a Provide 1<sup>st</sup> aid certificate (or higher).
